The first step in creating a field report is to read the Jottings chapter from Writing Ethnographic Field Notes (on D2L).

For each guest speaker or panel, use jottings and generate field notes.

Prior to the Field Report Due Dates, compile your field notes, with a one page summary of your findings, observations, and questions. You should be a) reporting on what you have heard; b) attributing ideas to specific people or groups; c) making observations beyond spoken words; and d) summarizing key ideas and questions for further pursuit.

Field Reports should include scanned copies of your original notes as well as a typed one-page summary. Reports are due on the following dates:
